We have learned starting next week, there will be two road construction projects that will most certainly affect the bus transportation for many of our students as well as for students who drive to and from school.

I-696 Expressway

Beginning Monday, April 16, 2018, the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will begin a complete reconstruction of the I-696 Expressway. According to MDOT, the traffic impact will be:

Macomb County: I-696 from Dequindre Rd. to I-94

Eastbound always OPEN. Westbound always CLOSED.

Oakland County: I-696 from Dequindre Rd. to I-275

Night & weekend lane closures.

Up to 10 complete weekend closures with detours.

Hoover Road

Beginning next week, Hoover Road in Warren from I-696 to 13 Mile Road is slated to begin repaving, which will have an impact on Cousino High School and Cromie Elementary. For Cousino and Cromie families, you will be receiving additional information from the school about traffic patterns and how to access each school.

The Road Ahead

It is anticipated that these projects will have a significant impact on traffic, causing delays in our bus routes and heavy traffic congestion for many parts of the district, especially I-696 and Hoover, which are two major roads for us. WCS will maintain close contact with state and local officials to minimize the effects of these projects while keeping the safety and security of our students and staff our number one priority.
